

## ELEPHANT ORPHANAGE

Born from one family's passion for Kenya and its wilderness, the David Sheldrick Wildlife Trust (DSWT) is today the most successful orphan-elephant rescue and rehabilitation programme in the world and one of the pioneering conservation organisations for wildlife and habitat protection in East Africa.

Founded in 1977 by Dr. Dame Daphne Sheldrick D.B.E, in honour of the memory of her late husband, famous naturalist and founding Warden of Tsavo East National Park, David Leslie William Sheldrick MBE, the DSWT claims a rich and deeply rooted family history in wildlife and conservation.

You can spend an hour at the orphanage in close proximity to the elephants. You will hear their individual stories from keepers and learn interesting facts about elephants and conservation whilst the babies are being fed their milk.
